



About the Conference

The Office of the Federal Coordinator for Meteorological Services and Supporting Research (OFCM) annually hosts the Interdepartmental Hurricane Conference (IHC) to provide a forum for the responsible Federal agencies, together with representatives of the user communities like emergency management, to review the Nation's hurricane forecast and warning program and to make recommendations on how to improve the program in the future. The major objective is to plan and prepare for the upcoming hurricane season. New procedures, procedural changes, and agreements, which are approved at the conference and are directly related to the provision of tropical cyclone forecast and warning services, are then documented for implementation in the *National Hurricane Operations Plan*, which is published annually.

Conference Format

The conference will begin on Monday afternoon with the keynote address by VADM Conrad C. Lautenbacher, Jr., USN (Ret.), the new NOAA Administrator, and will include a review of the 2001 hurricane season followed by a review of the year's reconnaissance activities. Tuesday morning's session will begin with a special presentation by Dr. Robert Sheets (invited), who was the Director of the National Hurricane Center during Hurricane Andrew. For the last 2 vears, research and operations presentations were integrated together to more closely link hurricane operations with ongoing research efforts, and this has proved to be an effective format. As a result, the subsequent sessions on Tuesday and Wednesday will include, as appropriate, a mix of research and operations presentations. Our growing poster session will be coupled with a reception early Tuesday evening, and the conference banquet will be held Wednesday evening. On Thursday morning, a series of workshops on hurricane program issues will be conducted, and conference attendees are invited to actively participate in a workshop of interest. Of particular note is the Workshop on the U.S. Weather Research Program (USWRP) Hurricane Landfall Experiment 2001. On Thursday afternoon, the OFCM-sponsored Working Group for Hurricane and Winter Storms Operations and Research will meet to work IHC-generated action items and changes to the National Hurricane Operations Plan. Then during the final plenary session on Friday morning, the working group and workshop chairpersons will summarize the findings and results of their meetings.
