
Sea Turtles Nesting

To help save the turtles, remember these friendly sea turtle tips: Turn off your lights that shine on the beach, refrain from making noise when females are nesting, leave nests and hatchlings undisturbed, remove beach chairs and other personal items that may obstruct nesting sites, and put trash in proper receptacles.
